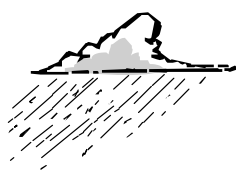

Special Report:
Jefferson Parish Government:
Hobby Breeder Friend or Foe?

On June 9, 2010 the Jefferson Parish Council took the first step in privatizing the operations of the Animal Shelter when the council passed an ordinance authorizing the Jefferson Parish Administration to enter into contract negotiations with the Louisiana Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (LASPCA). In two separate contract bidding advertisements, the LASPCA was the only organization to submit a bid to assist Jefferson Parish in the administration of the East Jefferson and West Jefferson animal shelters. Surprisingly, the recommendation to accept the bid of the LASPCA was made without a review or recommendation from the full Jefferson Parish Animal Welfare Committee, as this occurred between meetings of that committee.

The recommendation to go with the LASPCA, at least for the purpose of entering contract negotiations, has caused quite a bit of controversy in the greater New Orleans dog community. The LASPCA has a controversial history of service for the City of New Orleans, reportedly having a high euthanasia rate that Jefferson Parish has been accused of having for quite some time. The LASPCA currently holds the contract for the City of New Orleans in performing the same functions as the Jefferson Parish Animal Shelter. At the council meeting on June 9, 2010 the head of the Jefferson Parish Animal Welfare Committee, Deano Bonano stated that the contract with the LASPCA will contain benchmarks and goals for the organization to meet in its work with the Jefferson Parish Animal Shelter. He also stated before the council that the final contract will be reviewed through the Animal Welfare Committee for the recommendation goes to the council for final vote.

The readers of this newsletter will be kept informed of this process as it goes through the Jefferson Parish Animal Welfare Committee. On another item, the committee has not concluded with the business of providing details to the Jefferson Parish Council on a more detailed definition of the term "Responsible Breeder," or has made any further recommendation on the Responsible Breeder Permit Fee, which was slated to be \$25.00 for a permit if any puppies are sold from a litter. The committee is supposed to report to the Council on these matters, but did not meet in May because of the Gulf Oil Spill. Deano Bonano is also the Jefferson Parish Emergency Operations Head, and had to give that matter his full attention for a time. The next meeting of the Animal Welfare committee was held on June 22, 2010. I will report on that meeting in the August 2010 newsletter.

Our Club President John Long encourages the membership to support the Jefferson Parish Animal Shelter in working to help improve the lives of the dogs in the shelter by going to volunteer to work with dogs in teaching basic obedience skills and to socialize the animals to make them more acceptable for adoption. Every month in the newsletter I also

Help the Jefferson Parish Animal Shelter

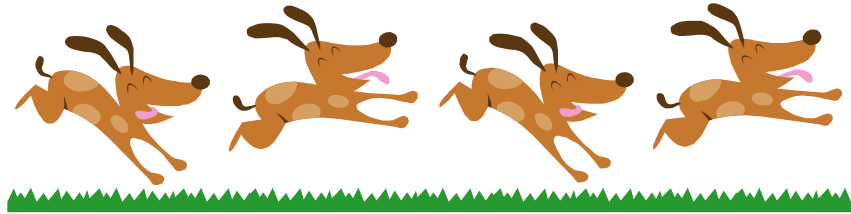
